



Raja Ampat / Misool 6 nights (Sorong to Sorong)
30+ dives recommended
Open water Diver or equivalent required

6 Nights / 7 Days| Up to 19 Dives

Day 1: Embarkation at Sorong Harbor (SOQ)

Upon embarkation, after the general boat and dive briefing, guests will enjoy a check dive at Matan Island (around 1 nautical mile from Sorong). The vessel will then cruise toward Misool following the check dive.

Note that check dive might be skipped if there's delay of guest arrival on this day.

Day 2: Fiabacet (4 Dives)

Dive 1 Whale Rock: A stunning site featuring a beautiful coral wall on the south and a ridge connecting to another rock and pinnacle rising to 14m. The reef is rich with soft corals, gorgonians, sea fans, and hard corals. Expect to see fusiliers, surgeonfish, barracuda, turtles, Napoleon wrasse, and possibly pygmy seahorses.

Dive 2 Nudi Rock: A spectacular site with a wall on the north side and a large plateau on the south. Covered with soft corals, gorgonians, black coral, and green coral. The site is teeming with marine life, including fusiliers, barracuda, Napoleon wrasse, turtles, jacks, blacktip reef sharks, and pygmy seahorses.

Dive 3 Tank Rock: Connected to Nudi Rock by an underwater ridge, this site features similar coral and fish life.

Night Dive Romeo: A popular night dive spot known for the Raja Ampat epaulette shark.

Day 3: Warakaraket (4 Dives)

Dive 1 Magic Mountain: One of the area's top dive sites with a high chance of seeing both reef and oceanic mantas in a single dive. This submerged reef rises to 5m with steep slopes and two cleaning stations. Rich in gorgonians, soft corals, and black coral, it's home to trevallies, fusiliers, Napoleon wrasse, whitetip and grey reef sharks, turtles, bigeye trevallies, and batfish.

Dive 2 Boo Windows: A signature site in Misool featuring vibrant reefs, gorgonians, sea fans, black and green corals. Fish life is abundant with fusiliers, batfish, barracuda, Napoleon wrasse, turtles, and pygmy seahorses. The dive often finishes at the unique "windows" in the reef — a great wide-angle photo

opportunity.

Dive 3 Boo East: Ideal for macro photography with a high chance of spotting pygmy seahorses and various nudibranchs. The reef is rich in gorgonians, sea fans, and soft corals, with regular sightings of fusiliers, surgeonfish, Napoleon wrasse, and turtles.

Night Dive: Boo Windows

Day 4: Wayilbatan (4 Dives)

Dive 1 Orange Peel: A picturesque ridge and wall dive. The wall is covered with bright orange soft coral, gorgonians, and has a healthy top reef with hard and leather corals.

Dive 2 The Four Kings: A submerged reef made up of four pinnacles, each at different depths (5m, 12m, 22m, and 23m). The pinnacles are covered in softcorals, black coral, and sea fans. Excellent fish life and occasional manta sightings.

Dive 3 Wedding Cake: A relaxed wall dives rich in soft corals and macro life, with good chances to spot pygmy seahorses.

Night Dive Batu Barracuda: Known for epaulette sharks, this dive features a wide plateau with corals and rubble, home to crustaceans, cuttlefish, and occasionally frogfish.

Day 5: Daram (4 Dives)

Dive 1 & 2 Andiamo: A vast site with a pinnacle and ridge that cannot be fully explored in one dive. Usually, the group is split between the pinnacle and ridge and then swapped for the second dive. Both feature soft corals, gorgonians, black coral, green coral, and sea fans. Common sightings include fusiliers, batfish, surgeonfish, Napoleon wrasse, turtles, bumphead parrotfish, and occasional mantas.

Dive 3 Daram's Reef: A submerged reef rising to 1m, with a top covered in hard corals and slopes all around. Great fish life, a known site for spotting wobbegong sharks, and occasional manta encounters.

Day 6: Sagof (2 Dives)

Dive 1 Baby Rock: A small rocky island with beautiful walls and ridges. The reef is lush with sea fans, soft corals, and black coral. Marine life includes fusiliers, batfish, Napoleon wrasse, barracuda, and occasional giant grouper.

Dive 2 Two Tree Rock: Located near Baby Rock, this site offers impressive walls and overhangs. Rich coral life and fish sightings similar to Baby Rock, with occasional mobula rays.

Overnight Cruise to Sorong

Day 7: Disembarkation at Sorong Harbor (SOQ)

Guests disembark from Malaillo by 10:00 AM at the latest. Transfers to Sorong airport or local hotels are provided.

Important: The last dive of the trip will take place on Day 7. Divers are strongly advised to observe a 24-hour surface interval before flying.

Travel Tip:

ARRIVAL DATE: We highly recommend arriving in the city of embarkation one day prior to the cruise departure and staying at a local hotel. This provides flexibility in the event of unexpected flight or luggage delays, or cancellations.

DEPARTURE DATE: We strongly advise against booking international flights on the same day as disembarkation, to ensure smooth and stress-free transfer.
